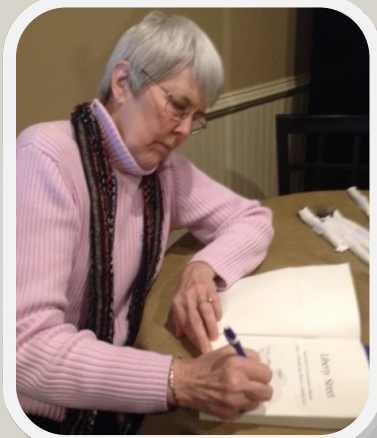
Women's Reading Fellowship

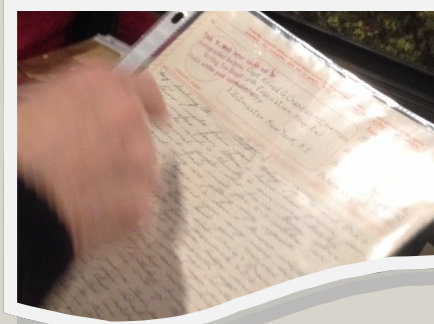


Author, Carol Chandler Malcarney. Thank you for sharing your parent's story!

The next Fellowship Breakfast takes place on Saturday March 12 at The First Baptist Church of Haddonfield.

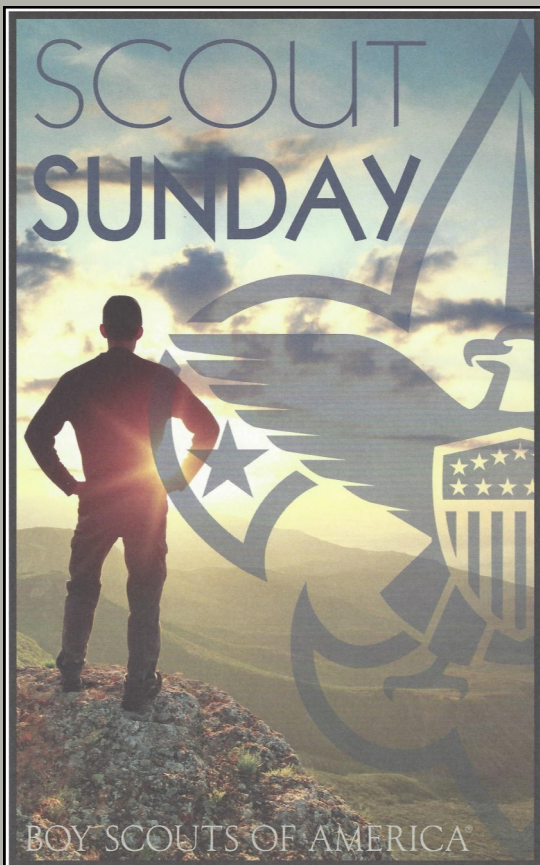
Bill Keane, a member of First Baptist, will be our speaker. Bill will be speaking on meeting the needs of young people.
