Celebrating the Wilderness

Some years ago I took off with a Baptist men's group. We were bound for adventure, ready to leave the humdrum of Iowa City, where I was in graduate school, for the wilds of the Minnesota boundary waters. It was a long trip to Ely Minnesota, where we rented our canoes and equipment. We were ready for carrying our canoes over five portages to travel from lake to lake. Each lake seemed more and more remote, more and more pristine as we traveled farther and





farther away from the habitation of people. I loved to listen to the loons and imitate their call across the water. I enjoyed the freedom to dip my cup into the untouched lake for a drink of water. At early evening, when we stopped our paddling and made it for our campsite, we were always ready for the unsurpassed treat of just taking in the spectacular beauty of God's creation.

Augustine said that God has given us two revelations of himself one is the Bible and the other is nature. The Book of Genesis says

that the trees of the Garden of Eden were pleasant to the sight. We need eyes to see, ears to hear and skin to touch the beauty of the natural world as a marvelous evidence of God's divine nature.

We reflect on William Cullen Bryant's beliefs about beauty in nature. True, we have managed to destroy the forests, toxify the earth and acidify the oceans. But whenever we manage to get away from human destruction of the world, we find something of the original paradise of God's creation.



John Muir, great nature photographer, writes, "everybody needs beauty as well as bread, places to play in and pray in where nature may heal and cheer and give strength to body and soul alike."

We need to make peace with nature. To stop destroying and start the healing process. We need to remember that we are not only stewards of creation, we are also part of the network of creation. To save nature from exploitation will be the means of preserving our very existence, which is a part of the web of life on God's creation. How will you preserve nature? Think about it as we near Creation Sunday, April 24.



John Michael Nazak

John was born in Lyndora, Pennsylvania on September 9, 1925, to Michael and Anna Nazak – the fourth of five children. His siblings have predeceased him. In his youth, John had a paper route, played basketball, was active in Boy Scouts and when old enough helped his father on Saturday deliver bread from the family bakery. He was extremely proud of attaining the rank of Eagle Scout. John graduated from Butler High School in 1943 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy at age 17. He served proudly as an Aviation Electronics Technician in Hawaii and Guam. After his discharge, he studied Electrical Engineering at the University of Pittsburgh where he received his degree in 1949. John married his high school sweetheart, Mary Rogers, on June 15, 1946, and they had three children. They were married for 52 years until her death in 1999.

John worked for the U.S. Government as a contract specialist, before joining the missile and surface radar division of RCA in 1956. He was named manager of radar marketing and range and reentry systems. In 1967, John was promoted to district manager for defense marketing in Dayton, Ohio. Upon relocating to Burlington, MA, he served as manager of radiation systems. In 1983, he returned to Moorestown as senior marketing manager for undersea warfare until his retirement in 1986.

John was a man of deep faith and commitment to the Lord. His membership at First Baptist Church of Haddonfield spanned more than 60 years where he taught Sunday School, served on numerous committees and boards, including Chair of the Executive Board. While living in Dayton, John was involved with the Dayton Christian Center, a social service agency, as well as the Dorothy Lane Baptist Church. After retiring, he became a volunteer reading teacher with Literacy Volunteers of America and was named Volunteer of the Year. An avid golfer, John was a member of the Moorestown Field Club for 30 years.

He was dearly loved by his wife of 15 years, Susan, and his children, Margaret Sutterley, Patricia Clement, Timothy Nazak (Karen) and his stepchildren, A. Richard Ross, Jr. and Pamela McIlvaine (Douglas). John went home to the Lord on March 15th and will be deeply missed by his wife, children, step-children, 5 grandchildren, 6 great-grandchildren and extended family members.


#### "The Wilderness"


