#### Looking forward...

As I write this month's Messenger before the due date of May 15th, I am looking ahead to what may be passed as you read it. For one thing, I am looking forward to the "Call to Prayer in Our Times," held Friday May 20th. Reading the signs of our times, I am not alone in hearing

Violence, racism, mass murders even in churches and schools, antagonism in government, abortions rates, decline in church attendance, weakening in faith in Christ, and God being pushed to the edges of our culture, give cause for alarm. I for one believe we need to turn back to God. The way to begin is by calling people to prayer. And so we have the "Call to Prayer in Our Times," gathering church folk and the general public at the Haddonfield Middle School auditorium. There will be testimony, prayers led by local pastors and offered by those in attendance, as well as hymns and praise songs to lift our spirits. I will be looking forward to hearing about your experiences at the prayer gathering.

I am also looking forward to a mission trip to Rwanda, sponsored by the American Baptist




Churches of New Jersey as well as The First Baptist Church of Haddonfield. We will pray, preach, baptize and visit our 10 village churches who work in cooperation with Seira Rwanda Baptist Churches, our partner organization. One of our goals is to visit the women's sewing cooperative who, because of your generosity through pledged mission support, support from ABCNJ and the Haddonfield Rotary have established small business initiatives to provide

income for the widows and families who suffer poverty. The women also receive training in literacy, bookkeeping, business skills and instruction in sewing. The school uniforms they make provide a sustainable source of income that they did not have before.

Finally, I am looking to the teacher and Christian Education Board meeting June 26th. The Board, myself, teachers and the Executive Board have supported the concept of not having Vacation Bible

School this Summer. Our past years have been successes; however, very little growth in our congregation as a result, even through various efforts have been made. The reality is that almost all of the children are members of churches already, and we have several VBS programs in Haddonfield. So, where do we go from here? We have decided to place our efforts and creativity into a "Sunday Enrichment" that will create a richer Sunday School experience



Someone once said, "Success is a moving target." We will continue to serve our congregation, community and mission in new and effective ways. Keep our people and ministries in prayer.


Rev. Méndez serves on the Board of Directors of the American Baptist Home Mission Societies and on the American Baptist






# Music Appreciation Sunday


