

Works by Jeannette Hanchett Gardner...or, as we affectionately know her, Jan.

God's Puppet Theater Puppet Presentation for Children in Honor of Memorial Day Tammy Rankine and Moses Chandran



My father, who died when I was ten, always stressed that every day should be a learning experience. Recently, I learned about the Gold Star Mothers Club. The American Gold Star Mother, Inc. was formed in the United States shortly after World War I to provide support for mothers who lost sons and daughters in the war. The name originated from the custom of families of servicemen hanging a banner called a Service Flag in the windows of their homes. The Service Flag had a star for each family member in the United States Armed Forces. Living service people were represented by a blue star, gold stars were for children who lost their lives. Today, membership is open to any American mother who lost a son or daughter in service in the United States. The Gold Star Mothers continue to provide emotional support to its members, doing volunteer work with veterans and fostering a sense of patriotism and respect for members of the Armed Forces. On the last Sunday in September, Gold Star Mother's Day is observed in the United States in their honor.


My education came from helping place flags with the Haddonfield American Legion Post 38 the Friday night before Memorial Day. The American Legion places flags in veteran's markers till the 4th of July. Charlesanna Fallstick brought to my attention that a Gold Star Mother was buried in the cemetery. She has since been honored with a marker and flag.



If you have a veteran from your family and a marker has not been placed at grave site, please let us know so that recognition can be bestowed on them. One of my goals was to honor all veterans with the marker. If you visit the cemetery, you will see markers without monuments; the veteran couldn't or didn't pay for a monument. but is honored by the marker.


