Dear Members and Friends,

This year our fall stewardship campaign, "Consecration Sundays", will focus on three Sundays: October 31st, November 7th and November 14th. Consecration means set apart for a purpose. Consecration comes from the word "sacred" which means holy. Our giving has a holy purpose.

On Sunday October 31st Rev. Vernl Mattson of ABCNJ will be preaching, and we'll be handing out reservation cards for the Consecration Sunday luncheon which will follow in two weeks. On November 7th I'll be focusing my sermon on the Biblical process of spiritual-growth-oriented stewardship. Our giving is an expression of our faith. We have a spiritual need to give. On November 14th we are asked to have our "Consecration Sunday" financial commitment cards ready to hand in. You will have received these forms earlier in the mail. A great celebration luncheon follows worship.

Why give? Because giving is part our growth as a follower of Jesus Christ:

On the first day of every week, each of you should set aside a sum of money you have earned . . . and give it as an offering. 1 Corinthians 16:2

How much should I give? That is up to you. The Bible speaks of giving the tithe, which is 10% of what we earn, in Malachi 3:8-10. Those who try the tithe find themselves blessed. Why not consider a percentage of what you have? A chart is in this Messenger to help you in your considerations.

Above all, let's see our giving as a spiritual action: See that you excel in the grace of giving . . . to prove the sincerity of your love. (2 Corinthians 8:7-8) Let's approach our giving as part of our spiritual witness as followers of Christ. Let the Lord use these Consecration Sundays for his purposes.

DID YOU KNOW?

Taken from "A History of the First Baptist Church of Haddonfield, New Jersey." "It is interesting to observe how history repeats or contradicts itself. On Jan. 29, 1923, when the refurbishing of the church sanctuary was being considered, the congregation voted to go ahead with a program of redecoration that would completely reverse the light color of the pews and woodwork to a dark finish.

At the same kind of meeting in 1965, the Church again voted on a refurbishing plan, this time to lighten the dark pews and woodwork and beautify the sanctuary in an unprecedented way." In 1965 the entire interior of the sanctuary was remodeled as it is now.
