### MILK FOR THE CHILDREN

On Thursday, August 11th, our mission team will be departing JFK airport for Chenai (Madras), India. We will be conducting our third year of mission outreach to the seven village churches near Nellore, India.

We have been developing good relationships with the pastors and congregations of the Bethel Baptist Association in the southeast province of Andrha Pradesh. This year we will be building on our efforts of the previous two years.

Our mission is focused on the needs of the very poor. The villagers of the churches work as share croppers for the large rice plantations of the land owners in the region. Conditions are in many ways primitive and lack the necessities of access to medical care, clean drinking water and sanitary conditions. Most of the children suffer from malnutrition.

The Lord loves these people. This year we will be bringing a word of hope and salvation, as we preach and minister in the name of Jesus Christ. Our mission will include the following components:

- A medical team including three doctors and three nurses
- Medical supplies
- Health and hygiene classes offered by volunteers
- Prayer and counseling
- Continuing education workshops for the pastors
- Preaching and prayer at the worship services

We will have medical and caregiver volunteers from First Baptist Haddonfield and will be joined by volunteers from the First Baptist Church of Collingswood and the First Baptist Church of Burlington. We are growing as a mission. Praise God!

This year we will also be introducing nutrition support. We call it MILK FOR THE CHILDREN. We would like to provide fresh milk and eggs for the needy children of the villages. With your help this can be a sustained effort carried out throughout the year under the supervision of the pastors of the village churches.

Your gift of \$8 can help feed a malnourished child for a month. We have identified approximately 90 children in the villages who are at risk. Can you help feed a child for a month? Can you help feed a child for one year? Please consider this opportunity to be of direct help to the poorest of the poor that we are reaching. Be part of our mission with your prayers and support. ### Cafeteria Deli Scores with Students

Students walked into the cafeteria on a dreary January Monday and instantly noticed that there were papers taped to the lunch tables. Simultaneously, shouts of "we're getting a deli!" could be heard. Excitement was in the air, and the stage was set for success.

The next day students rushed to the cafeteria, anxious to be one of the firsts to try the cafeteria's new feature. The line stretched to be at least 20 ft out of the door. No one chose to go for a different meal, intent on having a custom-made lunch.

If students chose to get a deli meal, they could choose their bread (Submarine, Kaiser Roll, white/wheat/rye bread or a wrap), their meat (ham, turket, or salami), their cheese (American, Swiss or Provolone cheese) and their condiments (i.e. lettuce, onions, oil, vinegar, etc.).

Since its introduction, the deli has been offered every Tuesday and Thursday. So far it has been a great success. One Eighth grader who has bought the meal multiple times says, "Personally I think that it's obvious why the deli is such a success. It makes you feel like your going out for lunch, even though you don't leave the building."

To further this experience, Haddonfield Middle School and Cafeteria administration have added a weekly soup on Fridays and are working towards the possibility of incorporating a salad bar into the cafeteria.




